



Kindergarten Enrolments for 2023

To enable us to correctly estimate enrolments and staff the school accordingly for 2023, I need all parents enrolling children K-6 to complete enrolment forms and leave their details at the office. Please let me know of any neighbours and friends, who may not have children already at this school but will have school age children for 2023, so we can then contact them and include them on our numbers for next year.

Head lice

Head lice have been problematic in the past few months. Please take the opportunity to treat your child's hair and remember to retreat after 7 days as lice have a 5-7 day cycle and if you miss even one egg you will find that re-infestation occurs very quickly.

Office Times

The school office opens at 8.30am each morning and closes at 3.15pm. Outside of these operating hours the office cannot process financial activities or administer first aid treatment in the sick bay. Those families staying onsite after the school day has finished take full responsibility for their children's wellbeing and safety. Access to the sick bay outside of the office operating hours is not permitted. Thank you for supporting the school with this endeavor.

PEANUTS/Anaphylactic reaction reminder

The number of children at Tighes Hill Public School with allergies to different food products and substances is growing. At this school we have students with severe (life threatening) reactions to peanuts and all tree nuts enrolled. To maximize the wellbeing and safety for all students, parents are asked not to pack peanut butter sandwiches or nut products for your children and to make sure that you are vigilant in reading labels of all pre-packaged foods. Please let's work together to provide a safe environment for all students.

Year 5/6 Canberra excursion


