

Selective HS Placement for Year 7 2022

Selective high schools cater for high achieving academically gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level.

Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 11th March 2021.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2022, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be has been sent home already last term https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/ year-7.

The application website opens at that link on Tuesday 13 October 2020 to Monday, 16 November 2020. You must apply before the closing date. There are no paper application forms.
